### What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Simplicity NZ Share Fund (NZ Share Fund) has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Simplicity NZ Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

### **Description of this fund**

The NZ Share Fund invests in securities listed on the New Zealand stock exchange (NZX), designed to be the New Zealand share component of a diversified investment portfolio.

### What are the risks of investing?

#### Risk indicator



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.


## How has the fund performed?

Investors are not charged individual action fees for specifications or decisions (for example, for withdrawing from or switching funds).


### Example of how this applies to an investor

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Aroha had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Aroha received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$872 (that is 8.72% of her initial \$10,000). Aroha also paid \$20 in other charges. This gives Aroha a total return after tax of \$771 for the period.
