What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Simplicity KiwiSaver Conservative Fund (Conservative Fund) has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Simplicity NZ Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

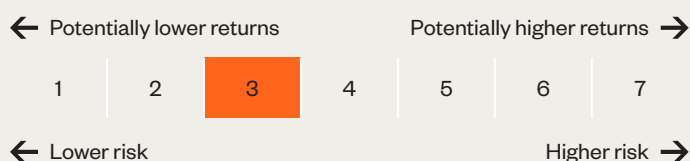
The Conservative Fund provides investors with a limited exposure to growth assets, but most of its investments are in income assets. As a result, the return from the Fund is likely to be lower over the longer term (10 years or more) than the Balanced or Growth Funds, but the value of its investments are unlikely to fluctuate as much as the Balanced or Growth Funds.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

As the fund has not been in existence for five years, the risk indicator is based on five year information including actual performance figures from 1 September 2016, and market returns data for the period prior to that date. As a result of this, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the fund. While risk indicators are usually relatively stable, they do shift from time to time. The risk indicator will continue to be updated in future fund updates.

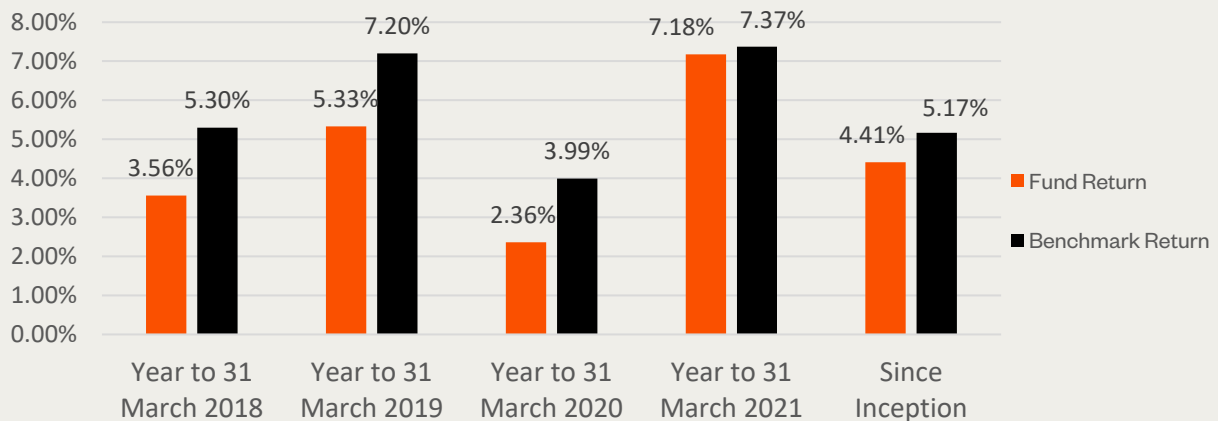

Example of how this applies to an investor

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

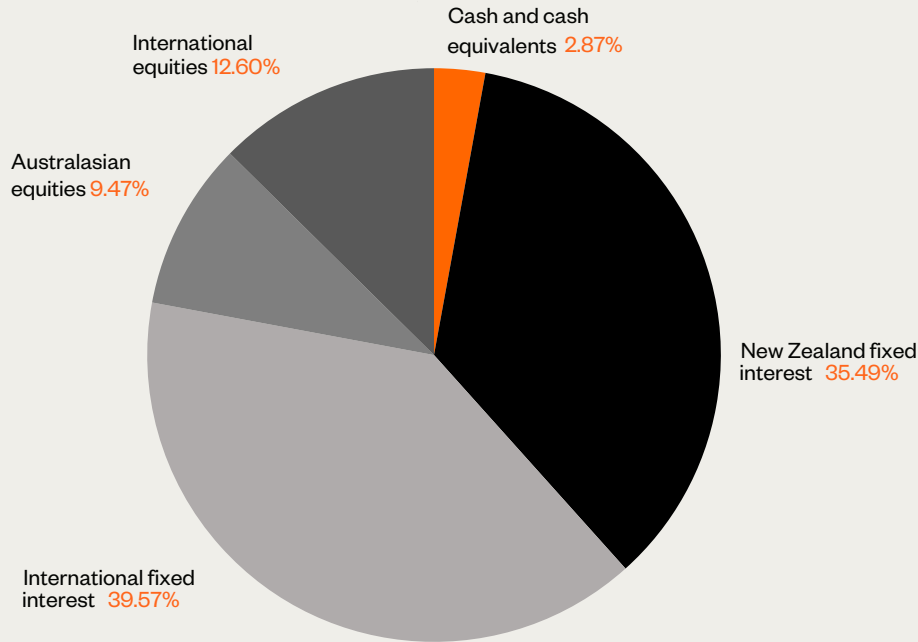
Carol had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Carol received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$738 (that is 7.38% of her initial \$10,000). Carol also paid \$20 in other charges. This gives Carol a total return after tax of \$698 for the period.

The top ten investments make up 72.75% of the fund. The fund's exposure to assets denominated in foreign currencies was 54.91%, of which 90.12% was hedged. This means the fund's unhedged foreign currency exposure was 5.42% of the net asset value of the fund.³

Notes

1. As the fund started on 1 September 2016, actual returns for the fund are not available until then. To calculate the risk indicator for the five-year period ending 31 March 2021, market index returns have been used up to 31 August 2016 with actual fund returns used for the balance of the period. As a result of those market returns, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the fund.
2. Other management and administration charges include a 0.01% estimated fee which covers administration costs incurred by the Vanguard underlying funds. This estimate is based on actual annual costs reported by Vanguard in its most recent annual report dated 30 June 2020 with additional details provided by Vanguard, and anticipated investment levels in the underlying funds in accordance with the Scheme's SIPO.
3. Our hedging policy is set using the average of the 12 main providers that we monitor, resulting in our international fixed interest and equity investments being 100% and 65% hedged into New Zealand dollars respectively. The hedging policy for equities is monitored quarterly and adjusted from time to time to follow the average within a range 50% - 70%.
